The Pomeroy Recreation & Rehabilitation Center (PRRCSF) was established in 1952 and has been serving children, teens, adults, and seniors with disabilities for nearly seven decades. The children and teen department offers programs six days a week, nearly 300 days of the year.

## Who We Serve

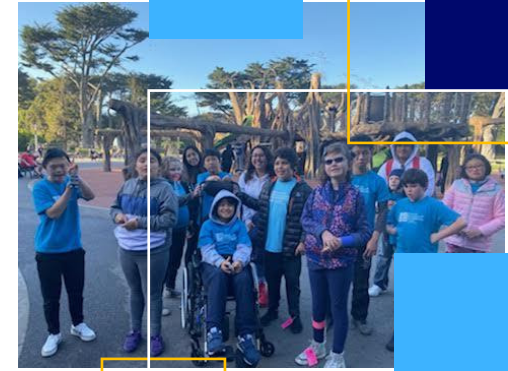
All children & teens with disabilities are welcome in our <sup>SEP</sup> programs. Children and teens with a variety of disabilities such as <sup>SEP</sup>Autism, Cerebral Palsy, slight to severe Cognitive Impairment, Downs Syndrome and other cognitive disorders attend our programs. The ages we serve are 5 to 21 years old.

## FACILITIES & PROGRAM ACTIVITIES

The Pomeroy Center has a large, warm water therapeutic swimming pool, a full-size gymnasium, a stage and hall for dance & drama activities, a computer lab, adaptive playground, garden, kitchen, and multiple program rooms set up for indoor activities such as arts & crafts and various educational games.



### SATURDAY RESPITE & RECREATION PROGRAM

### K-8 Program

The K-8 Department serves individuals with disabilities, ages 5-13 years old. Our curriculum is focused on learning appropriate social, developmental, and adaptive skills, while increasing functional communication techniques to enhance abilities of expression. Children participate in weekly social groups, sensory integration activities, arts and crafts, physical education, and swimming in our therapeutic pool. All activities and programs are designed to promote friendships, encourage participation and expand opportunities for community inclusion with the support of clinical services.

### Teens Program

Our Teens Program is designed with the person-centered planning model in mind to support the social growth and independence of our high school aged students. Activities include dance, arts & crafts, therapeutic recreation activities, sports, swimming, adaptive computer lab, community outings, and cooking classes. Services and consultations from our behavioral, speech, and occupational therapists are also provided weekly.

### Transition Age Youth Program

Our program for Transition Age Youth is focused on building vocational and living skills to support our student's growth and to develop independence, social skills, and to lead fulfilling lives. Activities include drama, dance, arts & crafts, sports, indoor and outdoor therapeutic recreation activities, swimming, computer lab, community outings, and cooking classes.



## DCYF PROGRAMS

### K-8 Sensing Success

Our Sensing Success program is designed to provide therapeutic services for children with disabilities. Participants join weekly occupational therapy groups, speech and language sessions, and the implementation of behavior support plans. We focus on behavior management, sensory needs, self-regulation, skill building and functional communication tools. Our clinical providers collaborate with staff and families to develop personalized strategies to ensure best practices incorporated into their daily routine.

### Skyline to Success Student Workers

Skyline to Success is a vocational group for Transition Age Youth. This program emphasizes basic job skills of timeliness, customer service, teamwork, and social skills needed for successful employment. We offer paid work time for our student workers. Jobs include event set up, snack service, housekeeping, gardening, and other projects around or involving the Pomeroy Center.



## SPECIAL EVENTS

The Children and Teen's Department hosts many amazing special events throughout the year, providing our participants memorable experiences that will last a lifetime for all those who attend. One of our biggest events is the Bay Area's one and only Prom for individuals with disabilities. The Pomeroy Center is transformed into an elegant evening to remember, for those 14-21 years of age. Limo rides, dinner, entertainment, and more are available to make the night one of our participants will never forget. For the month of October, Pomeroy's Pumpkin Patch (located near the pool) runs to raise money that directly impacts our clients. Support this incredible and festive fundraiser and purchase delicious treats, pumpkins and join fun weekend events that are sure to make the Halloween season Spooktacular!

Inclusion events are very important to Pomeroy as we work towards creating a more accepting and united San Francisco.
